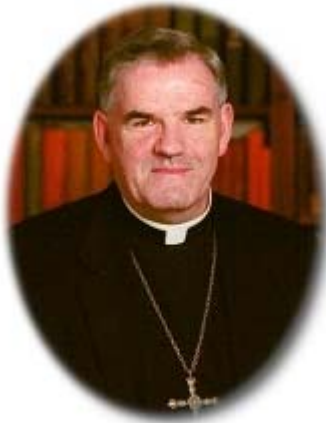

Bishop James Wingle was born in Pembroke, Ontario. Upon graduation from Brockville Secondary School, Bishop Wingle obtained an MA from the University of Windsor. He was employed for five years by the Ontario government in the corrections system. He completed his seminary studies at St. Augustine's Seminary and served in several parishes before pursuing postgraduate studies in moral theology in Rome, which he later taught at St. Augustine's Seminary.

Bishop Wingle was ordained a priest April 16, 1977, for the Diocese of Pembroke. In 1993 he was installed as the third Bishop of the Diocese of Yarmouth, Nova Scotia. On January 24, 2002 Bishop Wingle was installed as the fourth Bishop of the Diocese of St. Catharines in Ontario. A former president of the Ontario Conference of Catholic Bishops, Bishop Wingle serves as a member of the OCCB's Executive Committee, and also belongs to the Pontifical Council for Health Pastoral Care.
