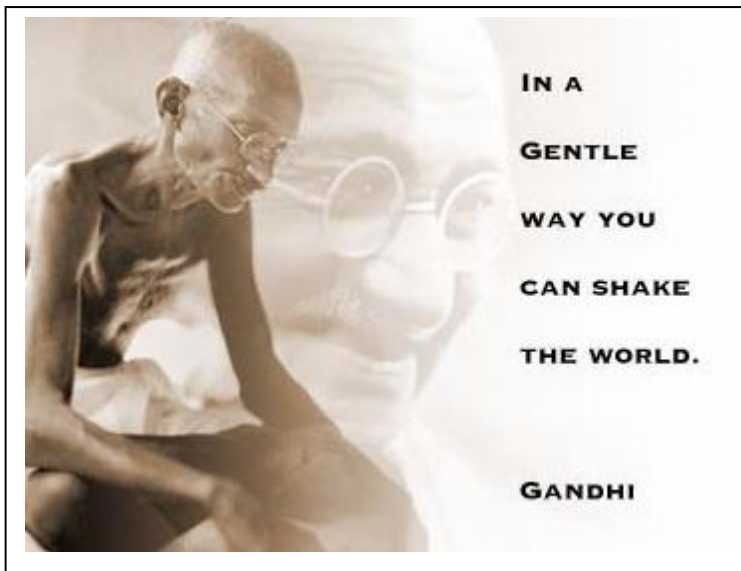


Foundations in Leadership

Purpose: To enable senior leaders, managers and directors in Catholic health and social service organizations to more effectively carry out their unique responsibilities as leaders of Catholic organizations.



Goals

- ✚ Ensure the on-going development of Catholic health and social services by mentoring leaders



Process

The learning process for the *Foundations in Leadership for Catholic*

Organizations focuses upon adult learning styles, inter-active presentations and periods of personal and group reflection. A selection of articles and books provide a base for discussion and reflection. The time together also provides a space for personal development. People are encouraged to leave work at work and live together for the three modules.
